

# Pattern

## COTTON FUN

### Crochet bag with granny squares

#### Difficulty Level:



#### Needles:



3,0 – 3,5

#### Quality:

Cotton Fun (company Gründl)  
100 % cotton  
50 g approx. 115 m



1 x 1 x 1 x 1 x 3 x

#### Size:

approx. 27 cm x 31 cm  
(without the bag handles)

#### Required quantity:

50 g each yellow (col. 04),  
orange (col. 18), pink (col. 20) and  
purple (col. 12), 150 g green  
(col. 12)

#### Basic pattern:

Sc in rd: Every rd of sc starts with one ch as a replacement for the 1st sc and ends with one sl-st into the first ch of the beginning of the rd.

Sc in RSR and WSR.: every r of sc starts with 1 tch as replacement for the 1st sc

#### Granny squares:

Crochet in a chain ring as follows:

1st rd: 1 ch as a replacement for the 1st sc, \* 1 ch, 1 sc, repeat twice after \*, end with 1 ch and 1 sl-st in the replacement ch of the beginning of the round

2nd rd: 1 ch as a replacement for the 1st sc, \* 1 corner (= 1 sc, 1 ch, 1 sc around the ch of the prev. rd), 1 sc in the following sc of the prev. rd, repeat twice after \*, end with 1 corner and 1 sl-st in the replacement ch of the beginning of the round

3rd rd: 1 ch as a replacement for the 1st sc, 1 sc in the following sc of the prev. rd, \* 1 corner, 3 sc in the 3 following sc of the prev. rd, repeat twice after \*, end with 1 corner, 1 sc in the sc of the prev. rd and 1 sl-st in the replacement ch of the beginning of the round

4th – 10th rd: work like 3rd rd, but crochet 2 sc in each rd between the corners.

#### Connecting the granny squares:

Crochet together the squares on the back, using sl-st. For that purpose place the squares next to each other, backside facing up, and only stitch into the respectively opposing stitches.

#### Tension sample:

sc: 23 stitches x 23 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm  
Granny square: 9 cm x 9 cm

#### Crochet pattern:

Wall of the bag: Crochet a total of 24 two-coloured squares with all 5 colours in different colour combinations. Change colour after 5 rounds each. For the colour change at the end of the 5th rd, work the last pull-through through the last sc and the sl-st in the new colour already. Make sure to use approximately

the same quantity of each colour. Connect the squares into a ring, according to the crochet pattern and the sketch. Crochet round the upper edge in green, with a total of 12 rd sc (21 sc per square = 168 sc), working 4 holes in rd 6 to pull through the bag handles. For that purpose, skip the 21st – 23rd, the 62nd – 64th, 105th – 107th, and the 146th – 148th st of the previous rd with 3 ch, and in the following rd crochet 3 sc each around the ch of the previous rd.

**Bottom of the bag:** Cast on 64 ch in green, and crochet 23 r of sc. Crochet the bottom of the bag to the bottom edge of the wall of the bag using sc.

**Bag handle:** Cast on 180 ch in green, and crochet 5 r of sc. Make a second bag handle following the same instructions.

**Finishing:**

Pull the crocheted bag handles through the holes from the inside out, and tie a knot in the ends. Carefully sew up all threads. In order to stabilise and shape the bag, put a rectangular piece of cardboard the size of the bottom of the bag in the bag.

**Abbreviations:**

- R = row
- rd = round
- st = stitch
- sc = single crochet
- ch = chain stitch
- tch = turning chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- rep. = repeat
- prev. rd = previous round
