Cuddly Jumper with Boat Neckline

Needles:

Mohana from Gründl
90 % Polyacrylic,
10 % Mohair

Size:

Women's EU size 36/38 (40/42)

Usage:

approx. 400 (500) g in col. 05
(rose-grey-taupe)

Needles:

1 pair of circular needles in size 5 - 6 mm or size needed to achieve given tension.

Tension:

16 sts and 21 rows to 10 cm meas over stockinette using size 5- 6 mm needles or size needed to achieve given tension.

16 sts and 24 rows to 10 cm meas over ribbing (slightly stretched).

Stitch Pattern:

Stockinette:

RS rows: k all sts between selvedge sts.

WS rows: p all sts between selvedge sts.

Ribbing: (amount of sts multiple of 2 + 1)

RS rows: k all sts between selvedge sts.

WS rows: selvedge st, alt k1, p1 and end row with k1, 1 selvedge st.

Garter Selvedge Stitch:

first st: k1 tbl and last st: sl 1 p-wise wyif

Instructions: (changes for larger size are given in brackets. If only one number is shown, this applies to both sizes).

Back:

Cast on 89 [93] sts (incl. 2 selvedge sts) and starting with a WS row, work 8 cm (= 19 rows) in ribbing patt. Then cont. to work straight in stockinette. When work meas total of 62 [65] cm (= 133 [139] rows) cast off all sts very loosely to create a small rolled edge on the boat neck.

Front:

Work as given for back.

Sleeves: (work 2 alike)

Cast on 35 [39] sts (incl. 2 selvedge sts) and starting with a WS row, work 4,5 cm (= 11 rows) in ribbing patt. Then cont in stockinette. For the side shaping starting with the 3rd row of stockinette inc 1 st on each side (= selvedge st, M1 tbl, work to last st then M1 tbl, selvedge st) (= 37 [41] sts). Make these incs in every foll 6th row 13 [14] times. (= 63 [69] sts). Then work straight until

sleeve measures total of 46,5 [49,5] cm (= row 99 [105]) ending with a WS row. Next row: cast off all sts k-wise.

Finishing:

Close all seams using the mattress st. To do so lay the pieces flat with right sides facing and place the edges directly next to each other. Using a blunt needle pick up sts under the horizontal bar between the first and second stitches, or directly under the cast off edge on the shoulder seam. Then insert the needle into the corresponding bar on the other piece. Alt from the left to the right. Pull the yarn firmly to close the seam after a few sts but not so tightly that the edges will pucker or shorten. This seam stitch creates a clean and almost invisible seam that hides the selvedge sts or cast off edges (shoulders). Continue to check that the seam stays elastic.

Close the shoulder seam along the outer 13 [14] cm on both shoulders leaving the centre 28 [30] cm open for the boat neck. Insert sleeves then close the side and sleeve seams. Weave in ends.

Pin out to measurements given, cover with a clean, damp cloth and leave to dry out of sunlight.
