Quality:

Cotton Quick uni (Gründl)
100 % Cotton (mercerised,
gassed and combed)
50 g / 125 m

Size:

Women's European size
36/38 (40/42)

Usage:

approx. 100 (150) g col. 01 (white),
approx 100 g each of col. 104 (bright
blue) and col. 106 (rose), approx.
50 (100) g col. 70 (silver grey)

Pattern:

Garter st.: RS and WS rows: K all sts

Stocking St.: RS rows: K all sts, WS rows: P all sts;
In rnds: K all sts in all rnds.

Selvedge St.: 1st st in row: sl 1 k-wise. Last st in
row: K1.

Colour and Pattern Sequence:

* 2 rows garter st using col 70, 14 rows in stock-
ing st using col. 104, 2 rows garter st using
col. 70, 14 rows in stocking st using col 01, 2 rows
garter st using col 70, 2 rows in stocking st using
col 01, 2 rows garter st using col 70, 14 rows in
stocking st using col 106, 2 rows garter st using
col 70 **, 14 rows in stocking st using col 104,
2 rows garter st using col 70, 2 rows in stocking
st using col 01, 2 rows garter st using col 70,
14 rows in stocking st using col 01, 2 rows garter
st using col 70, 14 rows in stocking st using
col 106, 2 rows garter st using col 70, 2 rows in
stocking st using col 01, rep from * to ** one time
more, end with 2 rows in stocking st using col 01,
2 rows garter st using col 70

Tension:

24 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm using 4mm needles
meas over stocking st.

28 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm using 4mm needles
meas over zig-zag pattern.

Instructions: (The instructions are given for the
smallest size. Changes for larger size is given
in brackets. If only one number is shown this
applies to both sizes)

Back:

Using col 70 cast on 143 [155] sts (141 [153] sts +
2 selvedge sts). Work in colour and patt se-
quence.

Row 1: (WS): K all sts.

Row 2: (RS) Sl1 k-wise (selvedge st), K1, dec1, K31
[33], M1, K1, M1, K34 [38], dec2, K34 [38], M1, K1,
M1, K31 [33], dec1, K2 (K1, 1 selvedge st).

Row 3 and all foll WS rows: Sl1 k-wise (selvedge
st), K to end of row if given in patt sequence as
garter, P to end if given as stocking st, K1 (sel-
vedge st).

These 2 rows set the patt. Rep cont for 9 cm ending with a WS row.

Side Shaping: (dec 1 st each side)

S11 k-wise (selvage st), K1, dec2, K30 [32], M1, K1, M1, K34 [38], dec2, K34 [38], M1, K1, M1, K30 [32], dec2, K2 (K1, 1 selvage st).

Rep these dec. every 8th row 12 times. (= 117 [129] sts). Cont. in the col and patt sequence and work as established in Row 2 in the other RS rows until piece meas 39cm (row 119) ending with a WS row.

Armhole:

Next row: Cast off 13 [14] sts, K1, dec1, K5 [6], M1, K1, M1, K34 [38], dec2, K34 [38], M1, K1, M1, K5 [6], dec1, K1, selvage st.

Next row: Cast off 13 [14] sts k-wise, work row to end in patt. (= 91 [101] sts).

Work straight until piece meas 56cm ending with a WS row (= Row 167).

Next row: Cast off all sts k-wise.

Front:

Work as for back.

Finishing:

Close shoulder seam (see schema= 3,5 [4]cm).

With right sides facing pick up 74 sts evenly along each arm opening and work 3 r in garter st. Next row: Cast off all sts k-wise. Sew side seams using back stitch, or mattress stitch as preferred. Weave in ends.
