ECO COTTON

Poncho with granny squares



Difficulty level:



Needles:



3 - 4

Quality:

Eco Cotton (Gründl)
100 % Cotton (biological)
50 g / 105 m



Size: S/M

Consumption:

ca. 250 g colour 01 (sand), each approx. 50 g colour 09 (sage), colour 04 (pastel nature), colour 03 (mocha), 08 (chocolate), colour 10 (may green), colour 12 (jeans), colour 07 (light blue)

Granny Square:

Work according to crochet pattern. Cast on 7 ch in any colour and close to loop with 1 slip stitch. Work 1. round in same colour. Crochet 1. row with 2 ch as replacement for 1. dc and end with 1 slip st into 2. replacement ch. Pull thread through loop on needle and cut off, as the colour changes after each round. With the new colour, start at corner of prev. round with 1 slip st. and 1 ch as replacement for 1. dc and finish round with 1 slip st. into replacement ch of start of round. Pull thread through loop on needle again and cut off. Crochet 1. - 4. round once.

Stitch test:

1 Granny Square over 4 rounds = 10 cm x 10 cm

Instructions:

Crochet a total of 42 Granny Squares in any colour combination, make sure that each colour is used at approx. the same frequency. Stitch up threads carefully. Now, crochet squares together with colour sand according to crochet pattern and pattern design. In the process, crochet around 1. square with ch arcs according to crochet pattern. Start respectively at the upper right edge with 1 slip st. From the following squares, crochet together the sides of the adjacent squares with sc around the opposite ch arches according to crochet pattern.

Completion:

Crochet around neck line in colour sand, connect loop at the rear corner (= at the centre of the rear part) and continue in rounds as follows:

1. round: crochet 1 ch as replacement for 1. sc, and crochet 1 round of sc. Hereby, crochet respectively 4 sc around the entire ch arch (= ch arch, consisting of 5 ch) and respectively 2 sc each around the half ch arches (= the two ch arches at the corners of the squares) (= 160 sc). End with 1 slip st. into the replacement ch of the beginning of the round.

2. round: 2 ch as replacement for 1. dc, skip 2 st. of previous row, respectively 1 dc. into following 2 st., * skip 2 st with 2 ch, 1 dc each into the following 2 st., repeat another 17 times from *, i.e. crochet until 3 st before the front corner. Then skip 2 st. 1 dc each into the following 2 st., skip another 2 st, 1 dc each into the following 2 st. Now work the round according to pattern continue from * and end at the rear corner with 1 dc into the last st. of the round. (Note: The 2 ch before and after the two dc at the front and rear corner are omitted to create a nice tip); end the round with 1 slip st. into the 2. replacement chain of the start of the round.

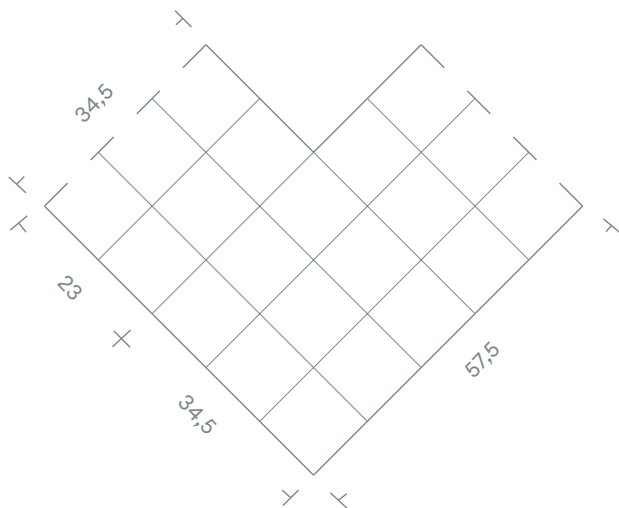
3. round: Start with 1 ch as replacement for the 1. sc, then crochet sc, hereby placing the sc into the dc of the previous row, but around the chain of the previous round. Cast off 2 sc together at the front corner, end with 1 slip st. at rear corner.

Knot a fringe bundle of approx. 5 × 32 cm-long threads into every ch of the entire bottom edge; finished length of fringe approx. 15 cm.

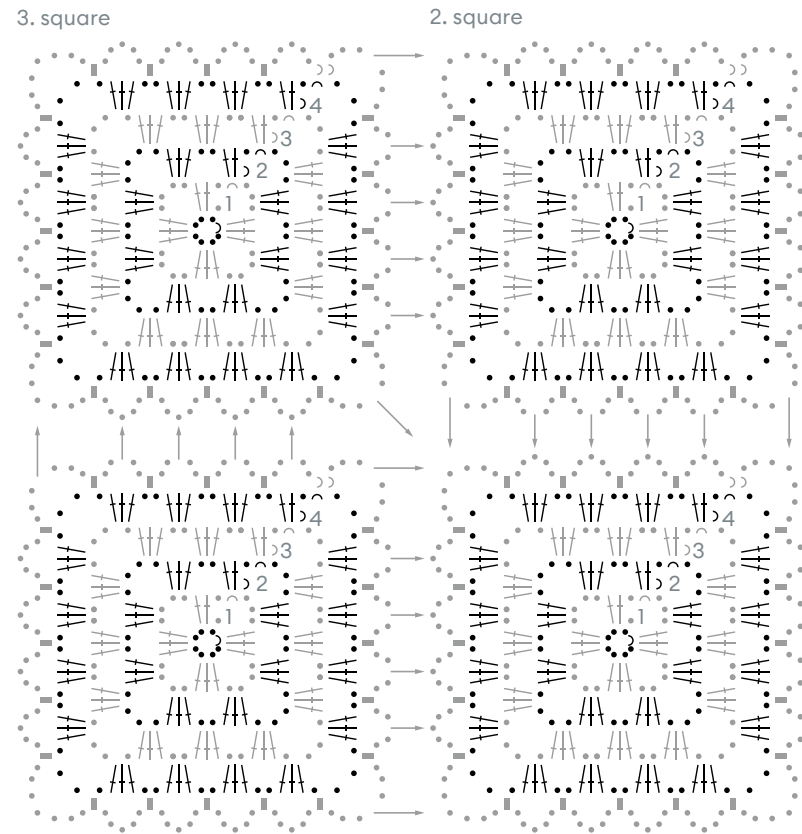
