
Colorful Patchwork Look Back



Difficulty level:



Needles:



Quality:

Filzwolle uni from Gründl
100 % Virgin Wool
50 g / 50 m



9 x 3 x 2 x 2 x 2 x 1 x

Size:

Bag unfelted: (laid flat)
Width: Upper edge approx. 60cm, bottom of bag approx. 52cm

Height: approx. 66 cm (bag upper edge to the edge of the bottom)

Bag felted: (measured standing)
Width: approx. 42 cm (upper edge of bag)

Height: approx. 40 cm (without bottom)

Depth: approx. 8 cm

Usage:

approx. 450 g in col. 62 (petrol),
approx. 150 g in col. 16 (dark blue),
approx. 100 g each in col. 04 (grass green), col. 17 (pigeon blue) and col. 12 (royal blue),
approx. 50 g in col. 59 (lime)

Tension:

(meas over stockinette st)
11 sts and 16 rows/rnds to 10 cm meas over stockinette stitch unfelted.

15 sts and 27 rows/ rnds to 10 cm meas over stockinette stitch after felting.

Stitch Pattern:

Stockinette st in rows:

RS rows: k all sts, WS rows: p all sts.

Stockinette st in rnds:

k all sts in all rnds.

Selvedge Stiches:

At beg of row k1 tbl and end of row sl 1 p-wise wyif.

Colour Sequence:

Refer to Colour Chart!

Note: The amount of sts shown in the chart are the amounts at the beginning of the new colors. Integrate the new sts (incs) in the colours given in the chart.

Instructions:

Bag Front:

Using col. petrol cast on 58 sts (including 2 selvedge sts) and work in stockinette st according to colour chart. For the side shaping inc 1 st each side every 17th row (= at beg of row M1 tbl between the 2nd and 3rd st and at end of row between the third and second last stitches in the row.) (= 68 sts). When work meas total of 66 cm (= 106 rows) cast off all sts loosely.

Bag Back:

Work as for front.

Bag Sides and Bottom:

Using col. petrol cast on 16 sts (incl 2 selvedge sts) and work in stockinette st for 192 cm (= 308 rows). Next row: cast off all sts loosely.

Sewing Bag Together:

Place the long strip for the sides and bottom together with the bag front and bag back sides and sew together so the seam is on the inside of the finished bag. The seam should be approx. 1,5 cm wide. This will give the finished bag more

stability. Ease the strips on the bottom a bit because the Filzwolle shrinks a bit more in height than in width.

Handles: (work two alike)

Using col. petrol, cast on 8 sts (including selvedge sts) and work 16 rows in stockinette st. Then transfer the sts to a dpn and cont in stockinette sts worked in the rnd as foll:

* k all sts, push all sts to other end of the needle, do not turn work, rep from * pulling the yarn at the beg of the rnd taut to create a uniform cord. When the cord meas 80 cm (= 130 rows) work 16 rows back and forth (as the beg of the handle) then cast off all sts loosely.

Felting:

Wash the bag and both handles without other items in the washing machine at 40°C (warm water) using the wash cycle for cotton or coloured clothing (approx. 2 hours), spin cycle approx. 800-1000rpm, do not use a short cycle or water saving setting. Add a small amount of detergent without optical brighteners or softeners. Do not add softeners to the load. To assist the felting process add 3 tennis balls to the load. After felting remove immediately from the machine and shape and stretch the bag into form and as needed stuff with yarn remnants and allow to dry out of direct sunlight. Form the handles so the open ends lay flat and are the same size. Stretch the handles to the same size if needed. Allow to dry out of direct sunlight.

Finishing:

Sew the handles onto the front and back of the bag using matching sewing thread.
