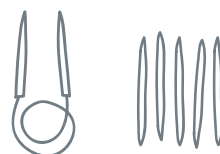
PACIFIC LACE

Lace Sweater with Headband

Difficulty level:



Needles:



3,5 - 4,5

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Quality:

Pacific Lace from Gründl
80 % Polyacrylic,
10 % Alpaca,
10 % Wool
100 g / 550 m

Size:

Sweater: Women's EU Size S - M
[M - L]

Headband: Head Circumference: approx. 52 - 56 cm,
Width: approx. 10 cm

Usage:

(for sweater and headband)
approx. 300 [400] g in col. 09
(chestnut-moss green-multicolour)

Stitch Pattern:

Sweater:

Ribbing: (amount of sts multiple of 16 +3)
alt 3 sts rev stockinette, 13 sts stockinette st and
end row with 3 sts rev stockinette

Stockinette:

In Rows: RS: knit, WS: Purl

In Rnds: Knit

Rev Stockinette:

In Rows: RS: Purl, WS: Knit

In Rnds: Purl

Slipped Selvedge: k1 at end of row, sll k-wise at
beg of row.

Lace Pattern: (see chart for reference, amount
of sts multiple of 16 plus 3)

Only RS rows are shown in chart, WS rows: work
the sts as they appear (k the knit sts and p the
purl) and purl the yos and sts worked together
from prev row.

Headband:

Seed Stitch: (worked with 2 strands held to-
gether)

WS: alt p1, k1

RS: purl the knit sts and knit the purl sts

Garter Stitch Selvedge: sll p-wise at end of row,
k1 at beg of row

Tension:

Sweater: 28 sts and 32 rows to 10 cm meas over
lace patt (before blocking)

26 sts and 32 rows to 10 cm meas over lace patt
(after wet blocking and drying)

Headband: 20 sts and 32 rows to 10 cm meas
over seed st (using yarn held doubled)

Tip for Colour Gradient: Start work on **ALL** balls
consistently either from the inside or the outside

Instructions:

Lace Sweater: (Changes for larger sizes given
in brackets. If only one number is shown, this
applies to all sizes)

Back:

Cast on 149 [165] sts (incl 2 selvedge sts) and

work in ribbing with slipped selvedge for 8 cm (= 25 rows) beginning with a WS row. Then work the lace patt between the selvedge sts, working the patt rep 9 [10] times and ending row with p3.

When work meas total of 55 [59] cm (= 175 [189] rows) place the centre 51 [55] sts onto a holder and work both sides of the neckline separately. For the inner neckline curve in every alt row cast off 2 sts once [twice] and one st 3 [2] times. When work meas total height of 58 [62] cm (= 185 [199] rows) cast off rem 44 [49] sts for the shoulder. Work second side in the same manner.

Front:

Work as for back, but when work meas total of 52 [56] cm (= 167 [179] rows) work the deeper neckline by placing the centre 45 [51] sts onto a holder and work both sides of the neckline separately. For the inner neckline curve in every alt row cast off 2 sts 3 times and one st twice. Work even until total of 58 [62] cm (= 185 [199] rows) then cast off rem 44 [49] sts for the shoulder. Work second side in the same manner.

Sleeves: (work 2 alike)

Cast on 85 sts (incl 2 selvedge sts) and work 3 rows in ribbing with slipped selvedge beginning with a WS row. Then work the lace patt between the selvedge sts, working the patt rep 5 times and ending row with p3. Work straight for 16 cm (= 51 rows) ending with row 12 in patt. Cont in ribbing patt and AT THE SAME TIME for the sleeve shaping M1 at beg of row after selvedge and at end of row before the selvedge st. (M1 = k1tbl using the horizontal bar between the sts). Make these incs in every 8th [6th] row 8 [13] times (= 103 [113] sts). Work the new sts in rev stockinette in the rows following the incs). Work even in patt for total of 43 [46] cm (= 137 [147] rows) then cast off all sts even in patt.

Block all pieces according to schema making sure to maintain the length.

Neckband:

Close the shoulder seams. Using the dpns and right sides facing, pick up along the neckline edge (including the sts from the holders) 128 [144] sts and work in ribbing patt in rnds (alt p3, k13 = 3 sts rev stockinette, 13 sts stockinette).

Rnd 1: alt p3, k2tog, k11 (= 120 [135] sts)
Work 8 cm (= 25 rnds) in ribbing patt (alt p3, k12)

Next rnd: purl all sts
Then work 8 cm (= 25 cm) even in established ribbing patt (alt p3, k12)

Next rnd: cast off all sts even in patt.

Fold the neckband along the purl rnd to the inside and sew cast off edge to neckline edge (begin of neckband).

Finishing:

Close the side and sleeve seams using the mattress stitch. Weave in ends.

Headband:

Holding 2 strands of Pacific Lace together, cast on 23 sts (incl 2 selvedge sts) and beginning with a WS row work 50 cm (= 160 rows) in seed st with garter st selvedges. Then cast off all sts in patt.

Finishing: (see sketch)

Fold the headband together lengthwise with the wrong sides to the outside (= 5 cm x 50 cm). Place the cast on edge on the cast off edge (= 5 cm x 25 cm).

Now turn the folded cast off edge (= 5 cm + 5 cm) 180° and slide between the folded cast on edge. The cast on and cast off edges are now lying together in 4 layers (5 cm wide). Sew all 4 layers together.

Turn the headband back to the right side. Weave in ends.
