Hat with Fur Pompon

Difficulty level:



Needles:



6-7mm

Quality:

Sylt from Gründl
80 % Polyacrylic, 20 % Wool
100 g / 130 m

Size:

Head circumference approx. 54 - 57 cm

Usage:

approx. 100 g in col. 08 (pool), 1 Fur Pompom Panda from Gründl in col. 57 (raspberry)

Stitch Pattern:

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Ribbing in rnds: (amount of sts multiple of 2)
alt k1, p1 throughout.

Double Seed St in rnds: (amount of sts multiple of 2)

Rnds 1. + 2: alt p1, k1

Rnds 3 + 4: alt k1, p1

Rep rnds 1 - 4 throughout.

Tension:

16 sts and 19 rnds to 10 cm meas over double seed st

16 sts and 22 rnds to 10 cm meas, slightly stretched, over ribbing patt

Pattern:

The hat is worked in rnds.

Using the dpns, cast on 60 sts. Divide the sts evenly amongst the 4 needles (4 x 15 sts) and close rnd being careful not to twist the sts. Work 10 cm (= 22 rnds) in ribbing patt. Then cont work in double seed st. When work meas 15 cm (= 29 rnds) from start of double seed st work the decs as follows and work the rows not shown in patt:

Rnd 52: p3tog over the 5th + 6th + 7th sts then over every foll 10th + 11th + 12th st, work the rem sts in patt. (= 50 sts)

Rnd 54: p3tog over the 4th + 5th + 6th sts then over every foll 8th + 9th + 10th st, work the rem sts in patt. (= 40 sts)

Rnd 56: p3tog over the 3rd + 4th + 5th sts then over every foll 6th + 7th + 8th st, work the rem sts in patt. (= 30 sts)

Rnd 58: p3tog over the 2nd + 3rd + 4th sts then over every foll 4th + 5th + 6th st, work the rem sts in patt. (= 20 sts)

Rnd 60: k2tog throughout (= 10 sts)

Cut yarn with long tail and pull through rem 10 sts. Pull yarn to close hole. Sew pompon onto the top of the hat. Weave in ends.
