


Pattern LIVING

Snood and Hat in Fisherman's Rib Pattern

Difficulty level:

Needles: Snood:



Hat:

Quality: Living (Gründl) 80 % Polyacrylic, 20 % Polyamide 100 g / 110 m



4 x 1 x

Size:

<u>Snood:</u> height: approx. 24 cm, circumference: approx. 130 cm <u>Hat:</u> Circumference approx. 53 cm – 57 cm

Usage:

<u>Snood:</u> approx. 300 g in col. 02 (rose) <u>Hat:</u> approx.100 g in col. 02 (rose), 1 fur pompom from Gründl in col. 01 (white)

Stitch Pattern:

Snood:

Fisherman's Rib with 3 selvedge sts: (amount of sts multiple of 2 plus 6 selvedge sts) 3 Selvedge Sts: At the beg of each row: k 1, sl 1 M p-wise wyif, k 1

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At the end of each row: sl 1 p-wise wyif, k 1, sl 1 p-wise wyif.

Row 1: 3 selvedge sts, * sl 1 p-wise with yo, k 1, rep from * to last 3 sts then work 3 selvedge sts. Row 2: 3 selvedge sts, * sl 1 p-wise with yo, k 2 tog (1 st plus the yo of previous row), rep from * cont to last 3 sts then work 3 selvedge sts. Rep row 2 cont.

<u>Hat:</u> <u>Ribbing in rnds: (</u>amount of sts multiple of 2) Alt k 1, p 1 cont.

Fisherman's Rib in Rnds: (amount of sts multiple of 4)

Rnd 1: * p 2, sl 1 p-wise with yo, p 1, rep from * cont. Rnd 2: * p 2, k 2 tog (1 st plus the yo of previous row), rep from * cont.

These 2 rows establish the pattern. Rep cont.

Tension:

<u>Snood:</u> 10 sts and 22 rows to 10 cm meas. over Fisherman's rib patt using size 9 mm needles or size needed to achieve given tension. <u>Hat:</u> 9 sts and 18 rows to 10 cm meas. over Fisherman's rib patt (in rnds) using size 8 mm needles or size needed to achieve given tension.

Instructions:

Snood:

Cast on 26 sts and work in Fisherman's rib pat. Cont. straight until work meas. total of 130 cm ending with a WS row.

Next row: cast off all sts in patt without yo's and working the yo's of previous row tog with the corresponding slipped st. Close back seam (cast on edge to cast off edge) using back stitch, or mattress stitch as preferred making sure to keep the seam flat and elastic.

Hat:

The hat is worked in rnds.

Using the smaller dpns cast on 56 sts and divide the sts amongst the 4 needles (2 × 12 and 2 × 16 sts). Join for working in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts work in rib patt. Cont. for 8 rnds until work meas. 4 cm then change to larger dpns (8 mm). and work in Fisherman's rib patt.

Cont in patt until work meas 18 cm from beg. = 33 rnds.

Rnd 34: * p 1, k 2 tog (1 p st and 1 k st with it's yo) p 1, rep from * to end of rnd. = 42 sts Rnd 35: * p 1, sl 1 p-wise with yo, p 1, rep from * to end of rnd.

Rnd 36: * k 2 tog (1 p st and 1 k st with it's yo), p 1, rep from * to end of rnd. = 28 sts Rnd 37: * sl 1 p-wise with yo, p 1, rep from * to last st of rnd then k 2 tog (last st of this rnd and first st and yo of next rnd tog). = 27 sts Rnd 38: * k 2 tog (1 p st and 1 k st with it's yo), rep from * and end rnd with k 1. = 14 sts Rnd 39: k 2 tog to end of rnd. = 7 sts Break yarn and thread through the remaining 7 sts and pull taught. Weave in ends. Sew on pompom to top of hat.
